

# **GOLYTELY COLONOSCOPY INSTRUCTIONS**

Thank you for choosing Weg Medicine for your colonoscopy procedure. Proper preparation (cleansing) is the key to a good examination. Please review these instructions more than 1 week before your procedure.

#### THE BOWEL PREPARATION:

You will need to buy:

- Pharmacy: Fill your prescription for Golytely
- Two tablets of Bisacodyl (Dulcolax<sup>®</sup>) 5 mg

WHEN	WHAT TO DO	DETAILS
At least <u>7 days</u> before your procedure	<ul> <li>If you take any medication for the purpose of being <u>anticoagulated</u>, keeping your blood thin or preventing blood clots (ex: Warfarin, Plavix, Coumadin, Xarelto) or are on <u>Diabetes medication</u> you must contact the office at least two weeks BEFORE your procedure, in order to receive careful instructions on how to manage your medications.</li> <li>Arrange for someone to drive you to and from your procedure</li> </ul>	
<u>4 days</u> before your procedure	<ul> <li>Stop eating foods that are high in fiber, and do not resume high fiber foods until after your colonoscopy.</li> </ul>	• <u>Examples of high fiber</u> <u>foods:</u> salads, corn, popcorn, green vegetables, brown rice, whole grain bread, beans, seeds, nuts

The Day Before your procedure WHEN	WHAT TO DO	DETAILS
-24 hours prior to procedure	-You can have a small breakfast up to 24 hours prior to your procedure time. -Beginning 24 hours prior to procedure time, start drinking ONLY clear liquids, (or clear liquids that are semi-solid, such as gelatin or popsicles) for the rest of the day.	<ul> <li>Avoid red or purple liquids</li> <li>Clear liquid only, see list of clear liquids below</li> <li>Do not drink any alcohol</li> </ul>
-12:00 NOON	<ul> <li>Take two Bisacodyl (Dulcolax<sup>®</sup>) 5 mg tablets with at least one full glass (8 fl. oz.) of clear liquid</li> <li>Mix golytely solution with water +/- flavoring packet, and place in fridge.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Bisacodyl tablets usually work within 8 hours. Do not worry if nothing happens from the Dulcolax before you start to drink the prep solution</li> </ul>
-5-6 p.m.	• Drink the <b>first half of the</b> <b>golytely solution.</b> (Drink 8 oz. every 15-20 minutes until half the bottle is consumed.)	<ul> <li>Do NOT drink entire bottle now, save half for the next day.</li> </ul>
At bedtime	<ul> <li>Keep drinking clear liquids only until bedtime</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>You may need to use the bathroom during the night</li> </ul>
The day of your colonoscopy		
4-5 hours before you are scheduled to arrive	<ul> <li>Drink the second half of the golytely solution</li> <li>(Drink 8 oz. every 15-20 minutes until completed).</li> <li>You can take your medications on the day of your procedure with small sips of water (see below if you are taking diabetic medications)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Do not eat or drink <u>anything</u> except your prep and small sips of water for your medications</li> </ul>
3 hours before you are scheduled to arrive	<ul> <li>ALL prep solutions should be finished. Nothing more by mouth until after your procedure.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Call the office if you have questions</li> </ul>

Clear Liquids that are OK (the day before your procedure):	Things to Avoid:
<ul> <li>Water</li> <li>Black coffee or tea</li> <li>Sports drinks</li> <li>Clear carbonated beverages and sodas</li> <li>Lemonade, apple, white grape or white cranberry juice</li> <li>Jello, popsicles, Fruit Ice</li> <li>Hard candy, honey</li> <li>Chicken and beef broth or bouillon</li> </ul>	Milk or dairy Alcohol ANY Red or purple liquid

## **GENERAL INFORMATION:**

• Please arrive on time. Allow extra time in your trip for weather, traffic and parking.

• **Medications:** Unless otherwise instructed, continue to take all of your usual medications on your regular schedule.

- Please bring a list of all the medications you take (including dosages and how often each medication is taken) with you to your appointment. Also list any herbal or vitamin supplements you take.
- **Personal belongings:** On the day of your sedated procedure, we strongly recommend that you leave valuables (money/jewelry) at home or give them to a family member or friend for safekeeping.
- **Travel:** While a colonoscopy is generally a safe procedure, there is a small chance of developing complications that may not be identified for up to a week or more after your procedure. We suggest that you do not plan this procedure within a couple of weeks prior to traveling, or an important social event.

#### REGARDING YOUR MEDICAL HISTORY AND MEDICATIONS:

• If you take any medication for the purpose of being <u>anticoagulated</u>, keeping your blood thin or preventing blood clots (example: warfarin, Plavix, Coumadin), you must contact our office to speak with our staff at least two weeks BEFORE your procedure\_because you may need to stop taking them for a few days before your procedure. Aspirin does not need to be held.

• If you take any insulin OR any diabetes medication contact us as soon as possible

• Continue all other medications unless otherwise instructed.

• IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT A PARTICULAR MEDICATION, PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE

## AFTER YOUR PROCEDURE:

• REMEMBER: You may not drive, work, or engage in important decisions (e.g. financial

issues) for the rest of the day after your procedure.

• A responsible person must pick you up after your procedure to accompany you home
